Thammasat University visits Chuo

Thammasat University faculty members visited the Faculty of Policy Studies on May 23, 2017. One of Chuo's key partners located in Bangkok, Thailand, Thammasat has developed a strong tradition of specializing in law and politics since its founding in 1934, and now has many faculties covering a wide range of studies.

The guests also inspected the Faculty of Policy Studies' lecture rooms, as well as the "Audio Visual Studio" from which students broadcast "FPS News" on a voluntary basis using professional equipment.

As the Faculty of Policy Studies offers many courses in media and cultural expression studies, it has been strengthening its partnership with overseas universities that offer journalism studies. Furthermore, as part of Chuo's commitment to developing global individuals, the Faculty will continue to collaborate with Thammasat University and provide a variety of student exchange opportunities.

Collaboration with Chulalongkorn University, Thailand

The Faculty of Economics welcomed a group of students from Chulalongkorn University, Thailand, on June 1, 2017. Chulalongkorn University's Faculty of Economics is a partner institution of Chuo's Faculty of Economics and Prof. Hasegawa and his seminar students have been actively developing collaboration opportunities between the two universities. This occasion was their third collaborative event, following workshops held on the Tama Campus in January 2016 and May 2016. The June event started with a lecture from Prof. Hasegawa on "Growing ASEAN Economies and Trade in Value-Added", followed by lunch and a campus tour with students from both universities. The next collaborative event is planned for November, when Prof. Hasegawa and his students will visit Chulalongkorn University.
